MetaVis CLASSIFIER lets users organize SharePoint 2010 content. Users can apply metadata and relocate files anywhere in SharePoint with just a few clicks. From administrators struggling with too much content that was simply dumped into their SharePoint environment, to users working to categorize and locate their documents, tagging files in bulk has always been a challenge in SharePoint. **CLASSIFIER** allows you to tag and relocate previously loaded documents, in bulk, with regulatory data, retention dates, and useful keywords. You can classify legacy or imported content to unlock the full potential of SharePoint search and relocate content into the right folders, lists, and sites to maintain its accessibility, security, retention, and lifecycle policies.

MetaVis CLASSIFIER utilizes a familiar Windows Explorer user interface, allowing users to drag-and-drop items. **CLASSIFIER** deployment characteristics simplify its use in complex IT environments. The majority of the functions are performed using out-of-the-box SharePoint interfaces (APIs) and do not require any components or agents installed on the SharePoint server. In addition, it enables support for Microsoft Online (BPOS) and other hosted SharePoint deployments. A small MetaVis WEB Service can be installed on the target SharePoint WEB Front End enables retention of core item properties, like created by, modified by, created at, and modified at.

- *Change content type for multiple documents or list items*
- *Assign column values for multiple documents or list items*
- *Relocate several selected list items or documents to different folders, lists, or sites and simultaneously change or keep items content types and column values*
- *Copy values between columns*
- *Filter items in lists based on the user-defined criteria*
- *Analyze existing items in lists to ensure all values are in columns of the selected items*
